Cortaro Road On-Ramp at Westbound I-10 Closed Tonight

The Arizona Department of Transportation has made significant strides toward completing the much anticipated Interstate 10 - Twin Peaks Interchange. The following are upcoming traffic restrictions:

ON-RAMP CLOSURE: Westbound I-10 on-ramp at Cortaro Road will be closed from Thursday, Feb. 4 at 10 p.m. through Friday, Feb. 5 at 2 a.m. Traffic will be detoured onto the eastbound frontage road to use the Ina Road westbound I-10 on-ramp.

ROLLING LANE CLOSURE: A striping operation will be in effect along westbound I-10 between Cortaro Road and Avra Valley Road from Thursday, Feb. 4 at 10 p.m. through Friday, Feb. 5 at 2 a.m. Crews will operate in the right-hand lane, beginning at Cortaro Road moving west. A DPS vehicle will follow construction vehicles and direct motorists to use the left lane when passing the striping operation.

ADOT advises drivers to proceed with caution, obey all posted speed limit signs and be alert for construction equipment and personnel.

While ADOT strives to inform the public about planned roadway restrictions, during any complex construction project unscheduled closures or restrictions might occur. ADOT appreciates the driving public's patience as it constructs these improvements.
