Lane Closure at Intersections along Twin Peaks Road in Continental Ranch

The Arizona Department of Transportation has made significant strides toward completing the much anticipated Interstate 10 - Twin Peaks Interchange. The following are upcoming traffic restrictions:

During the week of March 22, crews will begin curb work along Twin Peaks Road in Continental Ranch, requiring a left lane closure at two intersections. The lane closure will be in place daily from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m. Monday through Thursday at both the Twin Peaks Road/Coachline Boulevard and Twin Peaks Road/Silverbell Road intersections.

Marana Police Department will be on site to direct traffic when necessary. A crosswalk will be open to the public while the intersection work is performed.

ADOT advises drivers to proceed with caution, obey all posted speed limit signs and be alert for construction equipment and personnel. Please do not follow construction vehicles into the work zone.

While ADOT strives to inform the public about planned roadway restrictions, during any complex construction project unscheduled closures or restrictions might occur. ADOT appreciates the driving public's patience as it constructs these improvements.
