This project will be managed in partnership by the Arizona Department of Transportation and the Town of Marana.

Intersection Work Requires Closure of Twin Peaks Road at Clover Way

As part of the Twin Peaks Interchange Project, the Town of Marana has partnered with the Arizona Department of Transportation to repair the intersection of Twin Peaks Rd. and Clover Way in Continental Ranch. **Work will require a full intersection closure beginning Monday, April 5.** Residents will need to use an alternate route to gain access to Twin Peaks Rd.

Detour signage will be posted throughout the residential areas; alternate routes are as follows:

- Residents living south of Twin Peaks Road will be detoured to Palmbrook Drive and Coachline Boulevard.
- Residents living north of Twin Peaks Road will be detoured to Mesquite River Drive and Palm Canyon Drive.

This intersection work is part of the greater effort to prepare Twin Peaks Road and Silverbell Road for asphalt removal and pavement replacement with new rubberized asphalt. Paving operations are anticipated to begin in late April.

Marana Police Department will be on site to direct traffic when necessary. A crosswalk will be open to the public while the intersection work is performed.

ADOT advises drivers to proceed with caution, obey all posted speed limit signs and be alert for construction equipment and personnel. Please do not follow construction vehicles into the work zone.

While ADOT strives to inform the public about planned roadway restrictions, during any complex construction project unscheduled closures or restrictions might occur. ADOT appreciates the driving public's patience as it constructs these improvements.
