Traffic Impacts Scheduled for Next Week in Continental Ranch Area

During the week of June 28, construction crews will continue work such as traffic signal installation and pavement striping along Twin Peaks Road and Silverbell Road from Cortaro Road to Twin Peaks. Minor lane closures will be necessary to complete the work.

In efforts to minimize impacts to the public, crews will be working two shifts Monday through Friday; day shifts will take place from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m. and night shifts will take place from 8 p.m. to 6 a.m.

Marana Police Department officers will be on site to direct traffic when necessary. During these activities, motorists are asked to be aware of cyclists and share the road.

This improvement is being made possible as part of the Twin Peaks Interchange Project, a partnership among the Arizona Department of Transportation, Town of Marana, and the Regional Transportation Authority.

ADOT advises drivers to proceed with caution, obey all posted speed limit signs and be alert for construction equipment and personnel. Please do not follow construction vehicles into the work zone.

While ADOT strives to inform the public about planned roadway restrictions, during any complex construction project unscheduled closures or restrictions might occur. ADOT appreciates the driving public's patience as it constructs these improvements.
